RE: Resolution 20-123-R: Approving a resolution to apply for Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) funding for Batavia Ave (IL Rt 31) Road Diet conversion from Fabyan Parkway to Millview Drive

Background:

In 2018, the City Council adopted a strategic plan which includes identify/enhance safe walking/biking routes to and through downtown. Based on that initiative, the Council desires to implement a Road Diet on Batavia Ave and has directed staff to apply for Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) funding. Illinois Department of Transportation is currently accepting funding applications for 2020.

Discussion

The ITEP provides funding for community-based projects that expand travel choices and enhance the transportation experience by improving the cultural, historic, aesthetic and environmental aspects of our transportation infrastructure. The ITEP is designed to promote and develop alternative transportation options, including bike and pedestrian travel, along with streetscape beautification.

If awarded, then the City of Batavia will receive Federal funds reimbursement up to 50 percent for right-of-way and easement acquisition costs, and up to 80 percent for preliminary engineering, utility relocations, construction engineering, and construction costs. Street lighting can qualify for either 80% funding or 50% funding, depending on whether the location is within a designated historic district or not. Hence, the City of Batavia will be responsible for the 20% or 50% local match as the project sponsor. The application process requires that the City of Batavia demonstrates sufficient funds will be set aside to cover the City's local share of the project cost.

Staff has prepared a resolution outlining all these commitments and is presenting to the Council for the approval. The complete application is due on November 2, 2020.

WHEREAS, the City of Batavia is applying for Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) funds in connection with for Batavia Ave (IL Rt 31) Road Diet conversion from Fabyan Parkway to Millview Drive; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, the City of Batavia will receive Federal funds reimbursement up to 50 percent for right-of-way and easement acquisition costs, and up to 80 percent for preliminary engineering, utility relocations, construction engineering, and construction costs. Street lighting can qualify for either 80% funding or 50% funding, depending on whether the location is within a designated historic district or not; and

WHEREAS, the City of Batavia will be responsible for the 20% or 50% local match as the project sponsor; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the City of Batavia demonstrates sufficient funds will be set aside to cover the City's local share of the project cost; and

WHEREAS, the City of Batavia commits to fund required portion of the project to cover its share of preliminary engineering, design engineering, right-of-way and easement acquisition construction engineering and construction costs,

SECTION 1: That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute this resolution acknowledging the obligations and responsibilities of the City of Batavia as outlined above.
