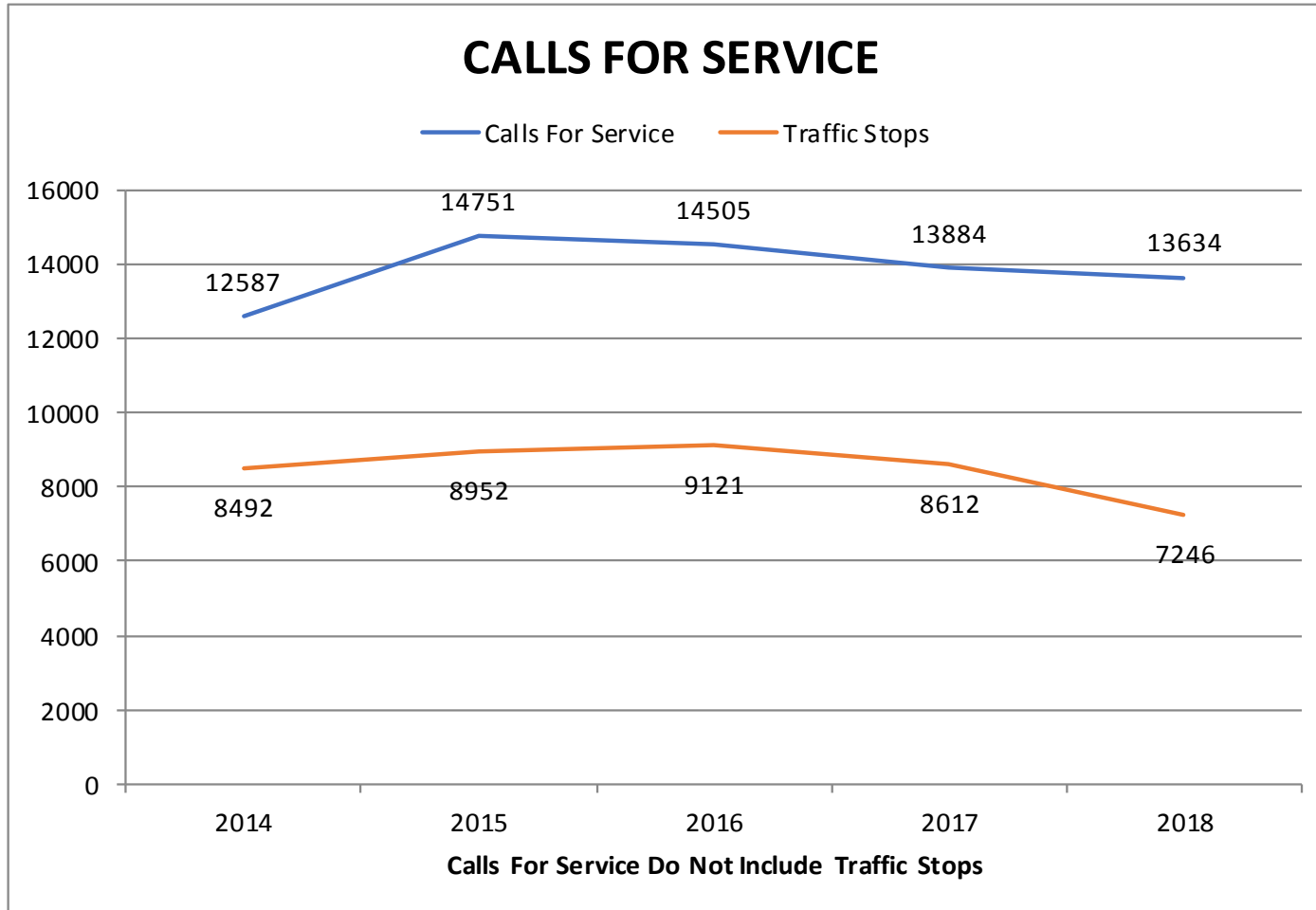

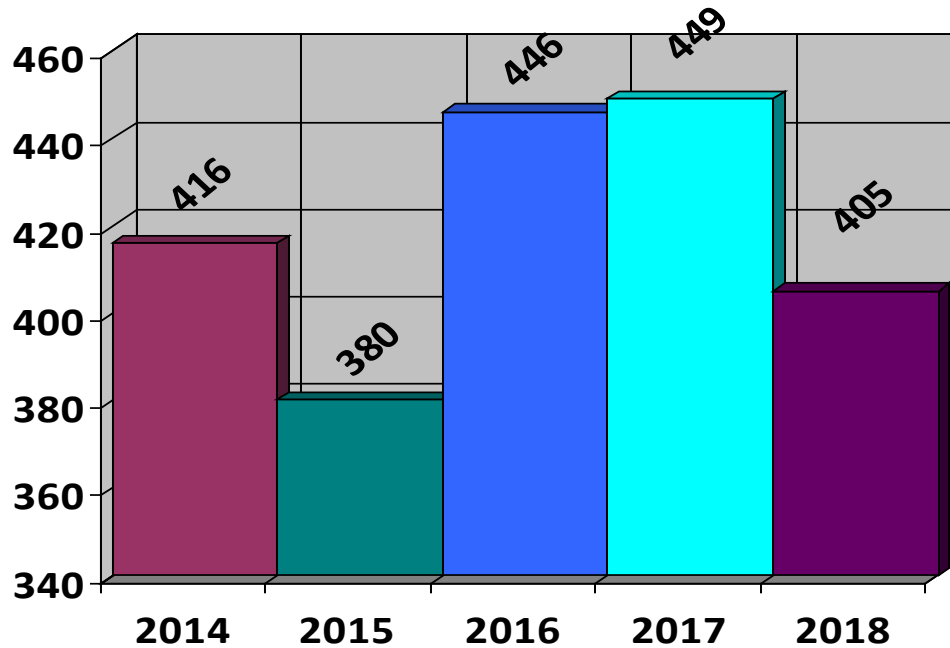


BATAVIA POLICE DEPARTMENT – CFS AND TRAFFIC STOP COMPARISON

CRIME STATS PART 1 OFFENSES

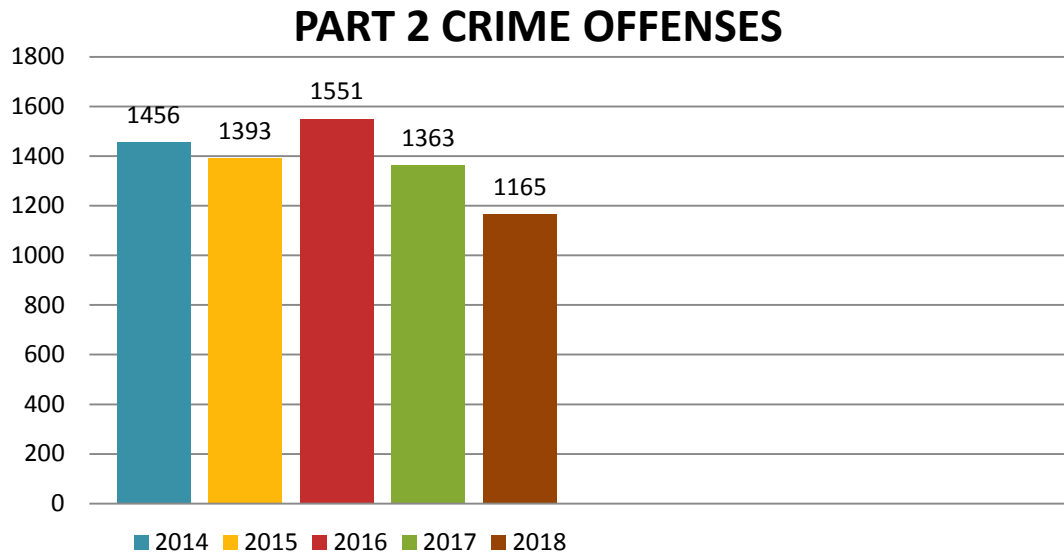


- Part I Crimes include: Homicide, Criminal Sexual Assault, Robbery, Aggravated Battery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson

- Part I Crimes down in all areas except: Criminal Sexual Assault (7% increase from 7 to 9) and Motor Vehicle Theft (45% increase from 7 to 15)



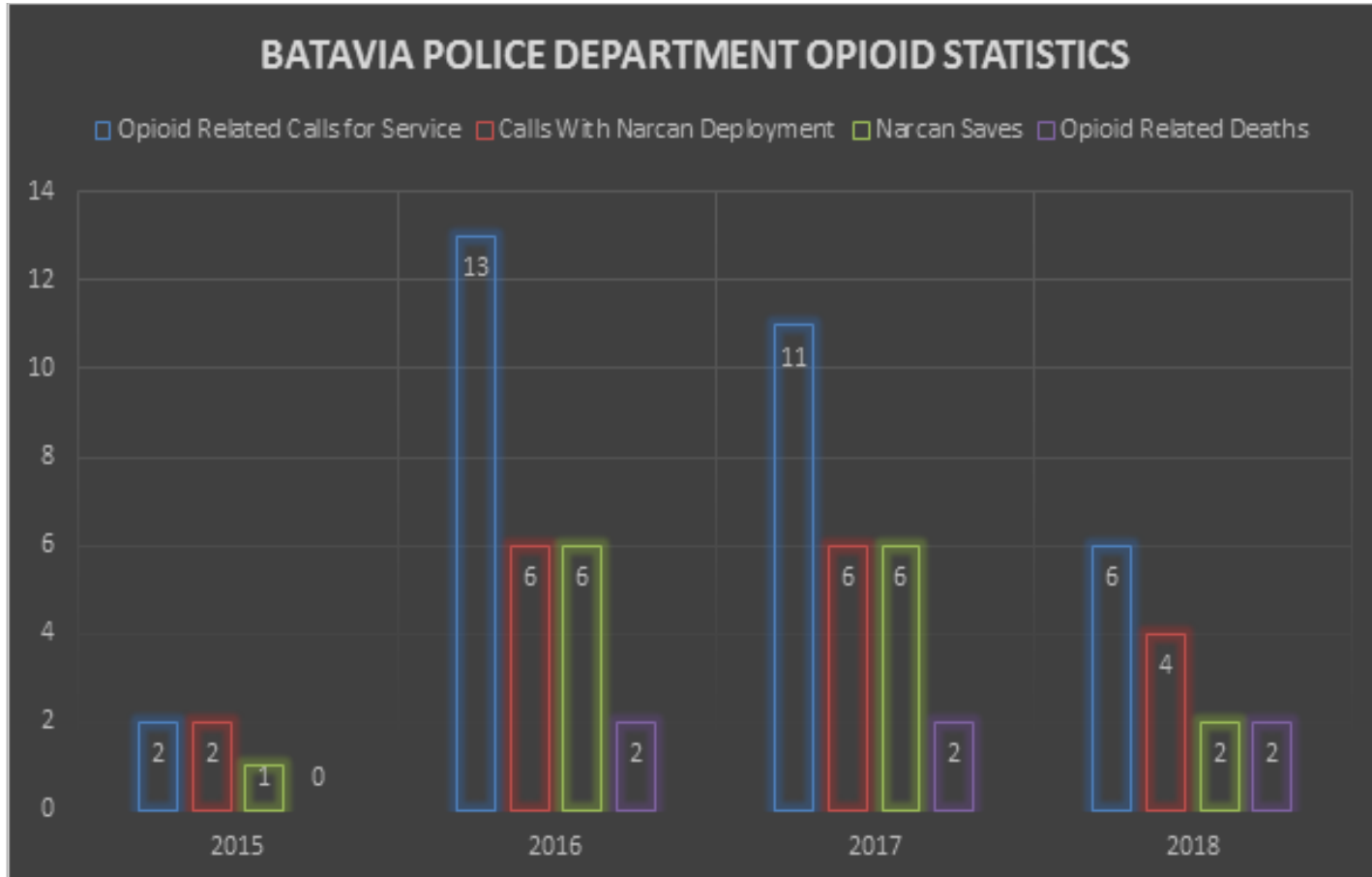

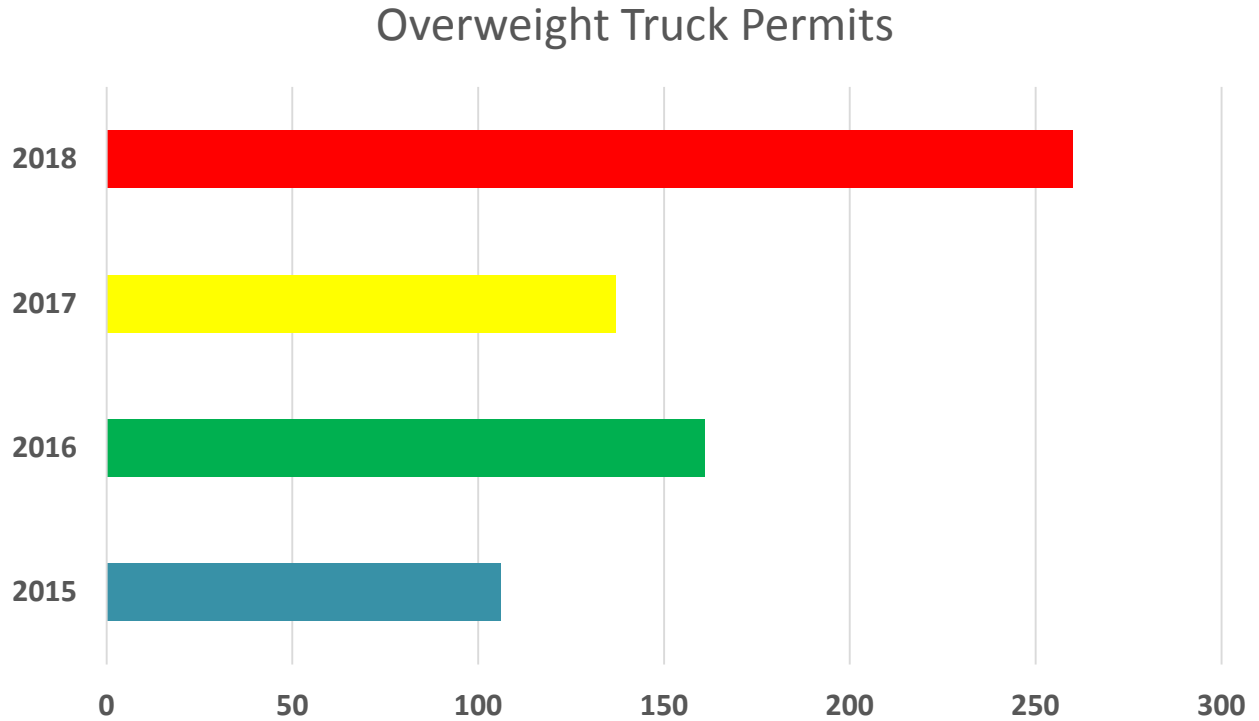

BATAVIA POLICE DEPARTMENT – OVERWEIGHT TRUCK PERMITTING

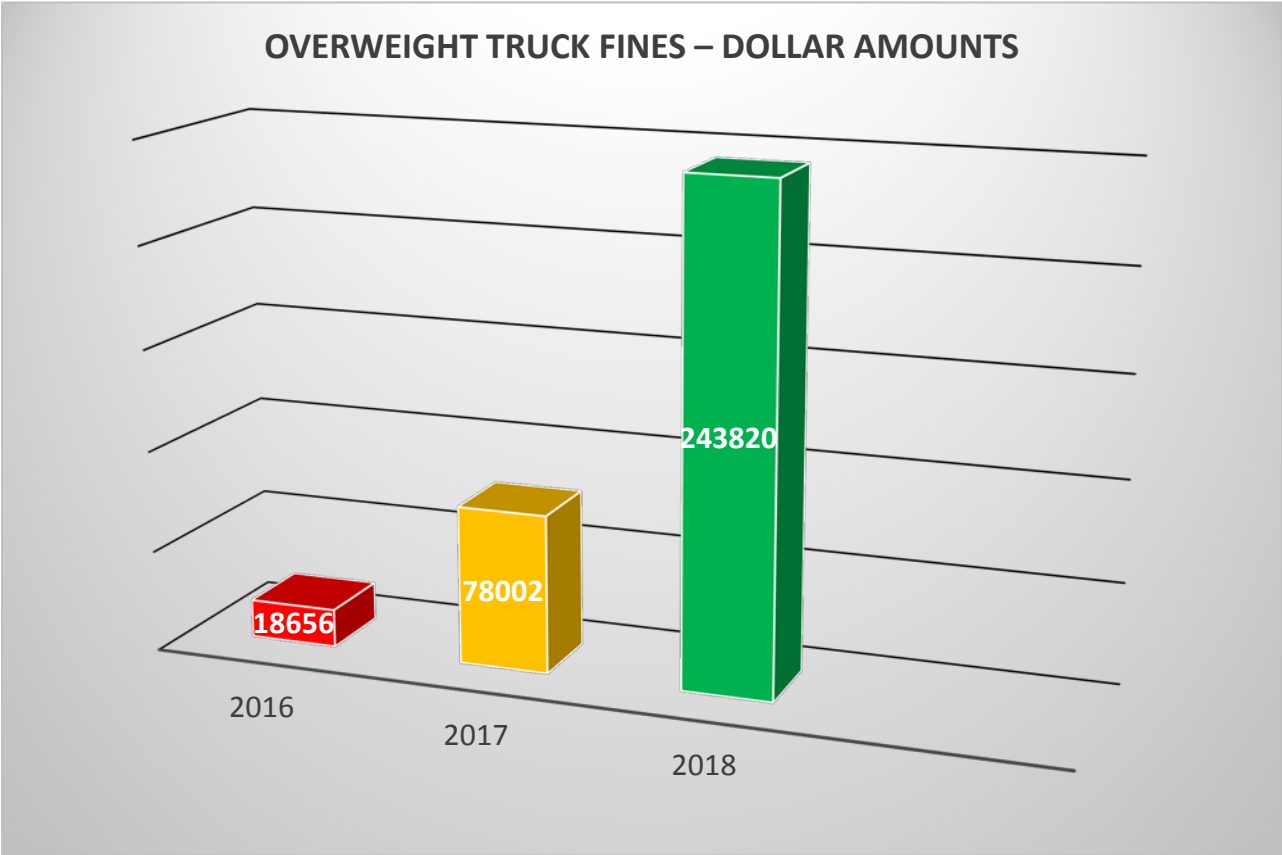

2018 TOTAL FEES COLLECTED VIA OXCART = \$18,365

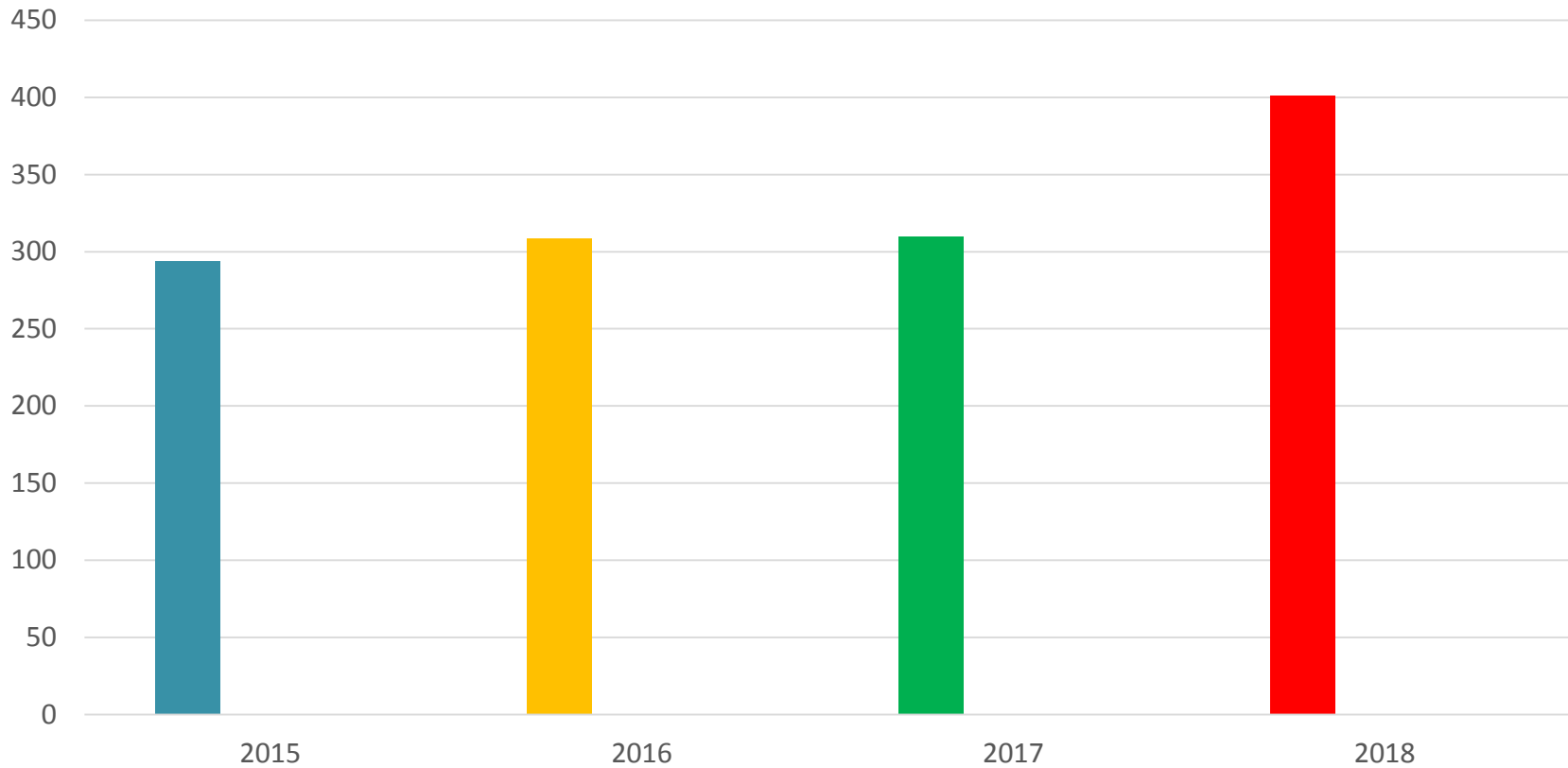


BATAVIA POLICE DEPARTMENT – TRUCK ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

BATAVIA POLICE DEPARTMENT – PERSONNEL OVERVIEW

Authorized (Budgeted) End Strength FY 2018 =

- 41 Sworn Officers
- 7 Full-Time Non-Sworn Employees
- 5 Part-Time Non-Sworn Employees
- 52 Total Batavia Police Department Employees**

Actual End Strength FY 2018 =

- 40 Sworn Officers
 - Budgeted 41st officer position placed on hold until 2019 due to Home Rule Referendum
- 8 Full-Time Non-Sworn Employees
- 2 Part-Time Non-Sworn Employees
 - 3 PT employees left unexpectedly during the year and vacancies refilled (with lag time for hiring and entry training)
- 50 Total Batavia Police Department Employees**

Hiring Projection for FY 2019 =

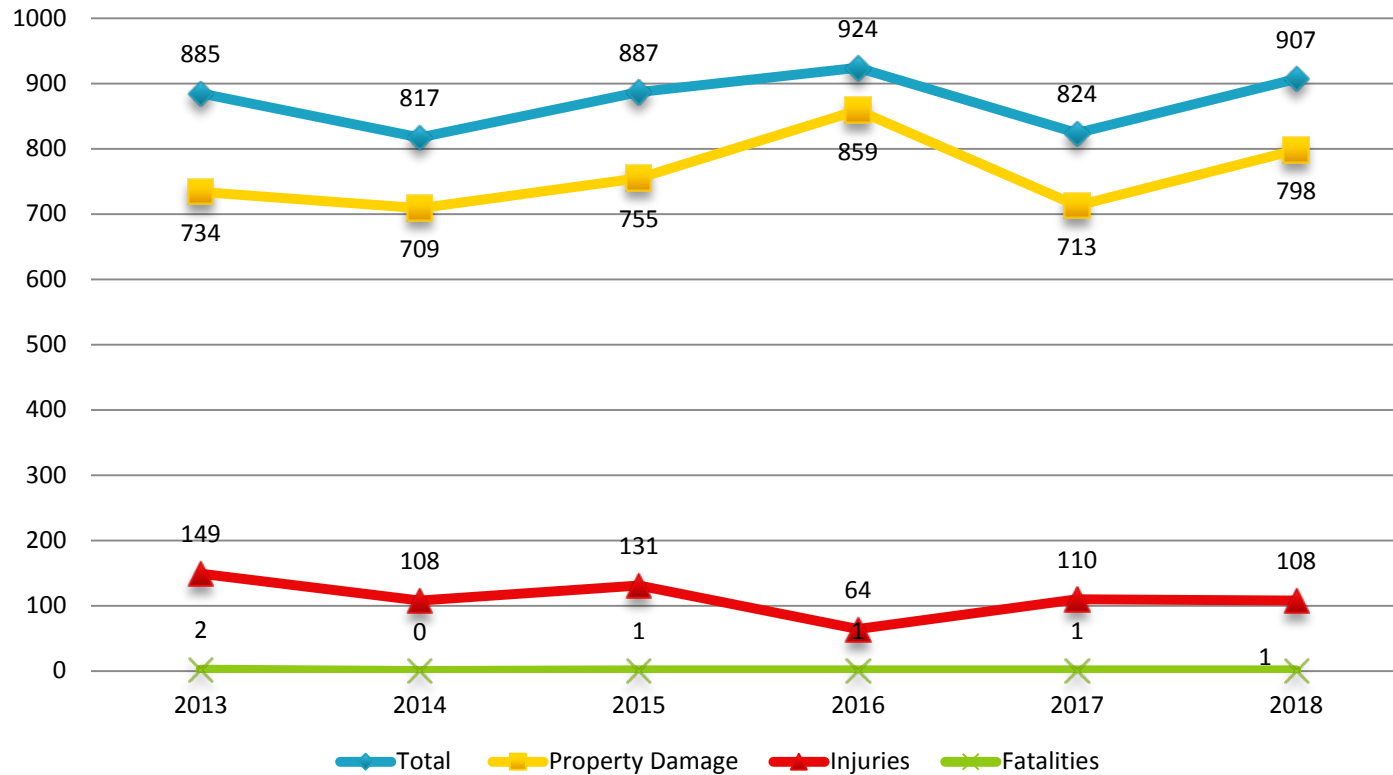
- 3 New Sworn Officers
 - One officer hired to replace attrition due to retirement in 2018
 - One officer hired to be added to North Central Narcotics Task Force
 - * 2 probationary officers hired on 3/6/19 and currently in Field Training and Evaluation Program
 - One additional retirement expected in August 2019

* Sworn officer temporary losses throughout the year include: one officer lost for 4 months (due to retirement – not replaced until March 2019); one officer lost for 3 months due parental leave; 2 officers lost for 3 months due to non-duty related injuries (one currently remaining off-duty in 2019); one officer lost for 5 months due to military deployment (continuing until approximately June 2019). In addition, several members of Patrol Division working part-time in other operational capacities (SWAT, Heroin Task Force)

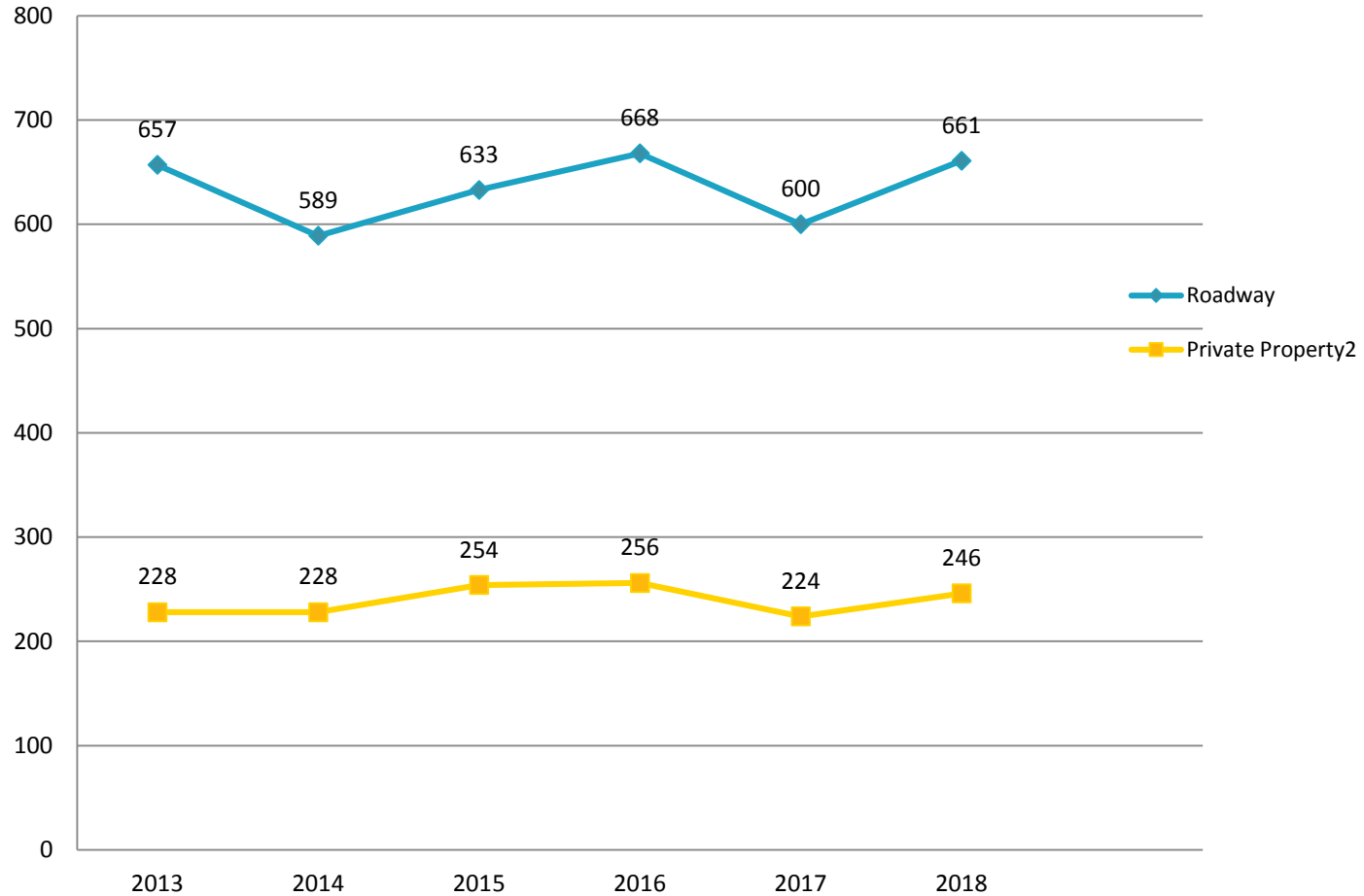
TOTAL ACCIDENTS BY YEAR



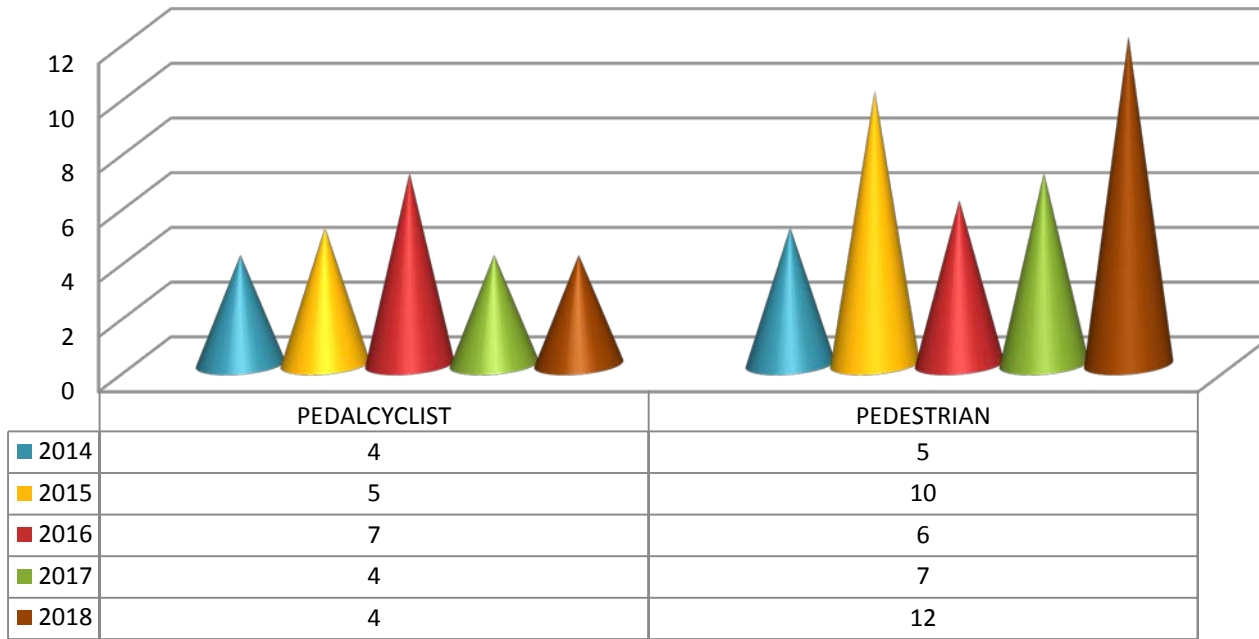

*Increase in Vehicle vs. Pedestrian Collisions in 2018. Our statistics in this area are in line with a trend experienced throughout the country last year.

Increasing Risk Factors: Distracted driving, distracted walking/bicycling, more SUV’s on the road (larger vehicles), walkability initiatives bringing more vehicles and pedestrians into conflict
