In addition to answering any questions that you might have about the process, the Community and Economic Development Department will also act as your single point of contact, coordinating multi-department oversight of your project.





The location that you select for your new business may require some alteration before you can open your doors for business. A permit is required to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move or demolish a building or structure. Erecting, installing, enlarging, altering, repairing, removing or converting or replacing any electrical, gas, mechanical, plumbing or fire safety system also requires a permit.

To ensure the most timely and cost-effective process, hire a professional, state-licensed architect to prepare your plans, being sure to pay attention to the local building code requirements.

Once your permit application is received it will be reviewed by our plan examiners who will provide you with a written report detailing any corrections that need to be made. Once all corrections have been made and after a final review, your permits will be issued.





Inspections

Depending on the project, a number of professional inspections may be required, such as for plumbing, electrical, building, mechanical equipment, fire suppression and public health. Once you have passed all final inspections, the City will issue a Certificate of Occupancy verifying that all of the requirements needed to open a new business have been met.
